Recycle or donate your old one!



Why Recycle or Donate?



To keep hazardous materials out of landfills  
To recover valuable materials to make new electronics  
To give devices a second life

Before you recycle:

Back up your data: Save photos, contacts, and important files.

Factory reset: Erase all personal information from the phone.

Remove SIM/SD cards: Take out any memory or SIM cards.

Where to Recycle or Donate:

Retailers: Many stores have bins for small electronics, including phones.

- Best Buy (in-store kiosks, mail-in, haul-away)
- Staples (in-store drop-off)

Manufacturers & Carriers: Apple, Samsung, AT&T offer trade-in or mail-in recycling, sometimes for credit.

Mail-in Programs:

Call2Recycle (free drop-offs at stores like Home Depot, Lowe's)

Secondwave Recycling (free shipping label for donations)

Cell Phones For Soldiers (provides communication for troops)

Medic Mobile (supports healthcare workers)
